- awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.
- 11 **Best in Show** Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
 - 12 Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
 - 13 Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
 - 14 All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
 - 15 All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
 - 16 **DOGS IN VEHICLES IN HOT WEATHER**
 - * When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - * If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - * The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - * Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - * When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - * Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so you dog stays well hydrated.
 - * Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.
- Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.
- WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE.**
- Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded at show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.
- 17 Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
 - 18 Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered
 - 19 No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
 - 20 The entrance fee of a dog entered but not brought will be forfeited.
 - 21 The Committee is empowered to exclude any dog which is not in a fit state for exhibition, either from disease, vice, natural or other causes, and if such expulsion takes place, either before or after the dog has been judged, the entrance fee will be forfeited.
 - 22 Should the judge be prevented from fulfilling his/her engagement, the Committee reserves to itself the right to appoint another judge. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw their dogs from competition, but no fees can be refunded.
 - 22 **FOULING:** An exercise area will be provided. It is required that any fouling outside the area provided should be cleared and placed in the sacks provided. This includes the car park and surrounding area in addition to inside the venue.
 - 23 All monies due to the Club which remain unpaid, either entry fees or bank charges accrued through dishonoured cheques, will be reported to the Kennel Club
 - 24 All children must be kept under control and parents will be held responsible for any damage caused and charges incurred.
 - 25 Any exhibitor with additional support needs required from the Club should notify the secretary by the entry closing date and every effort will be made to assist

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of this Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. 4th March 2022. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:- 1) Withdrawal - The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 20.

Transfer - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height. b) If an exhibit entered incorrectly in a minor puppy class, puppy class or junior class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the puppy class, Junior class or yearling class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no puppy, junior or yearling class to the open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height. c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height. If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dog of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twentyfour calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate /CACIB/CAC/Green Star or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate /CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not.

LIMIT: For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open Classes confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven of age on the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL BRED BY EXHIBITOR: For dogs bred by the exhibitor.

SPECIAL NOT BRED BY EXHIBITOR: For dogs not bred by the exhibitor.

SPECIAL COLOUR 'A': For dogs which are predominantly white with well defined patches of colour.

SPECIAL COLOUR 'B': For dogs which are predominantly black with tan, white or fawn markings allowed on face, chest, feet and tail.

CHAMPION For dogs which have been confirmed a Champion, Show Champion or Field Trial Champion.

BREEDERS: For dogs bred by the exhibitor.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1 The Show will open at 9.30 a.m..
- 2 Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3 Judging will not be before 10 a.m.
- 4 Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. Exhibits may not be removed earlier unless by written order of the Veterinary Surgeon, Veterinary Practitioner or of the Show Management and then only in very exceptional and unforeseen circumstances which must be reported to the Kennel Club. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5 The entry fee shall be:- Members £8.00 per first entry per dog; Non-members £10.00 per first entry per dog, £1.50 for all subsequent entries with same dog. Not for Competition £1.00. Catalogues £3.50 if prepaid, £4.00 on the day Membership - £5 [single]/£8 [joint]/ £1 [junior].
- 6 Prize money will not be paid.
- 7 The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 8 Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 9 The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 10 **Best Puppy in Show** (if scheduled) Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be

Dog fouling, grooming and waste (animal)

Any owner, exhibitor or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove immediately any fouling caused by their dog(s) and/or any grooming waste at any Kennel Club Licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event, including car and caravan parks and approaches. The chalking, powdering or spraying (with the exception of water) of exhibits within the precincts of the show is forbidden

DOGS IN CARS

EXHIBITORS SHOULD NOTE THAT REMEDIAL ACTION WILL BE TAKEN BY SHOW OFFICIALS IN THE EVENT OF DOGS LEFT IN CARS BEING FOUND IN A DISTRESSED CONDITION

IN THE INTEREST OF SAFETY IT IS REQUESTED THAT EXHIBITORS/ SPECTATORS ENSURE THAT YOUNG CHILDREN ARE KEPT UNDER STRICT PARENTAL/ADULT CONTROL AT ALL TIMES

REGULATION FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (B)

1 These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A11.

[a] A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there at.
[b] Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A11.

2 [a] No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.

[b] Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.

3 No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-

[a] operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.

[b] the removal of dewclaws of any breed.

[c] operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.

Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.

4 The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.

5 An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.

6 Any objection by an individual related by an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint
